ROMANIA - Voivodeni
Aid Needs

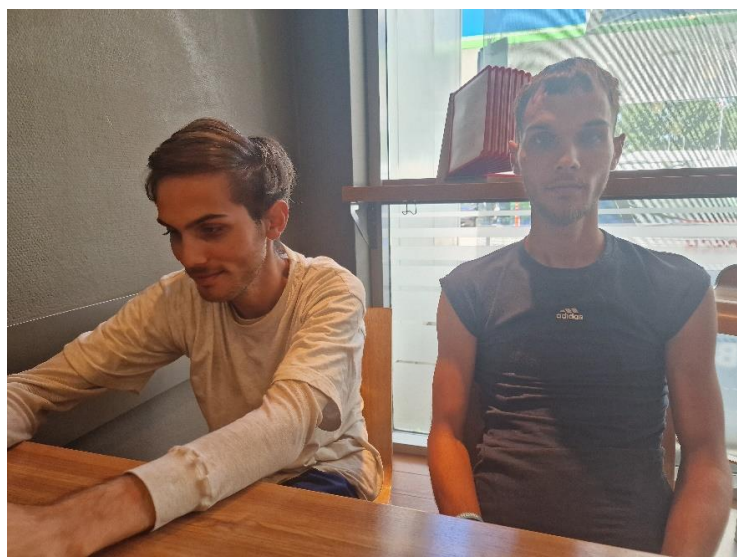

In Romania pensions are very low. Ilona Sütö who worked as a day laborer in the agricultural sector has a monthly pension of SEK 1,600. She is now suffering with a tumor on her face. Chemotherapy treatment will cost SEK 9,765, but her insurance does not cover her situation. She herself has no way of paying for treatment. When the tumor burst and the thin veins began to bleed, Ilona Sütö had to call for the priest Denes Caba to help her get to the hospital immediately. Denes drove her in the car, which SB Foundation gave to the congregation a year ago.

Another lady, who has also worked in agriculture, has had a stroke and is paralyzed on one side of her body. Her pension amounts to SEK 1,300 per month. She needs rehabilitation but that would cost SEK 11,500.

SB Foundation received a request for help. Yes, we were able to pay for Ilona Sütö's chemotherapy right away, but after that the funds came to an end, so we could not assist the other lady.



"I was contacted by two Roma twin boys. At the age of two months, they were abandoned by their mother and have been raised in an orphanage. Because they have now finished school, they are considered adults and can no longer live at the orphanage. Since leaving the orphanage they have lived in an abandoned car. They cannot receive their official identity cards, since they do not have a stable residence, and consequently they cannot get a job. The longer they live in the car, the more crooked their spine will become, Denes Csaba tells us. They are asking if we can build them a small dwelling. That would also result in a permanent address and make an ID card possible. Today they belong to no family, Denes concludes his letter. A dwelling of 45 m² (485 sq/ft) would cost about EUR 8,800 (somewhat in excess of SEK 100,000), but when SB Foundation asked if the price could not be reduced, Denes informed us that someone was willing to pay for the foundation and another person for windows and doors. This means that the house could be built if SB Foundation paid EUR 6,000 times in three installments of EUR 2,000. We hope to be able to achieve this. The case for helping these two boys who have had such a difficult life is persuasive. We would like to see them get a good start on their adult life and be able to support themselves.
